Tom is the author of Story Journey: An Introduction to the Gospel as Storytelling and a series of scholarly and pastoral articles on the Bible as performance literature. Tom is an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church and lives in Dayton.

This workshop will introduce pastors to everything needed to start a Bible storytelling in your local church: (1) Learning a story yourself; (2) Teaching others to learn and tell; and (3) the relationship between internalizing the scripture and a more vital life in the congregation.

This service of the nativity incorporates candles, hymns, music and prayer that is welcoming to all ages and accessible to church visitors not familiar to the story. Arranged to engage hearts, imagination and senses, Janet will walk participants through the story of Christmas using candles as the main characters. The complete service will be given as a handout to all participants with coaching on how to internalize the story in time for Christmas Eve.

Beyond the Memory Verse:

A Biblical Storytelling Approach to Christian Education Amelia Boomershine

The goal of engaging children with scripture is not to teach either doctrine or manners, but rather to acquaint with the God who loves them through the stories of and about Jesus. This workshop will introduce basic concepts and practices for telling, teaching and enjoying biblical stories with children. We'll use the Parable of the Mustard Seed from Mark 4 to demonstrate various activities. You'll go home knowing that story and also with a handout describing more activities than we'll have time to try out in one workshop session.

Staging the Story for Performance Brice Thomas

Telling a story from the Bible borrows many techniques from acting, yet in many ways it is quite a distinct art form. Instead of solely taking on one character, the storyteller describes the entire scene in the imagination of the audience. Because storytelling is usually done without many props or sets, this requires the storyteller to visualize the scene of the story in order to describe it physically while telling the story. A number of techniques will be used to do this: Locations, Reacting, Gesturing, Miming, Acting Out and Characterization.
